UNDER THE Sea

Located in the Baa Atoll, a UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve covering 303 hectares, and on the doorstep of Hanifaru Bay, Anantara Kihavah Maldives Villas is ideal for marine lovers. Each year, schools of manta rays migrate to Hanifaru Bay and hotel guests have the opportunity to meet and greet the gentle giants. Unlike eagle rays and sting rays, manta rays do not have stingers and are often curious so snorkellers can get up close as they glide by. The resort's house reef, The Golden Wall, is home to technicolour coral and attracts abundant sea creatures, which guests can observe while snorkelling or diving not far from the shore. Back on dry land, Anantara Kihavah Maldives Villas' 78 villas and residences, ranging from 260sqm to I,000sqm, are either perched over the Indian Ocean or nestled along a pristine private beach. Six dining and entertainment options include beachfront Plates serving Maldivian and international fare, and award-winning underwater restaurant Sea with its own grape cellar.
